FARM ACCEPTS KINDERHOOK'S YARD WASTE

The Town of Kinderhook has reopened the lawn and garden waste disposal site, Valley View Farm. The farm is located at 2560 Route 203, between Merwin and McCagg Roads. Compostable waste will be accepted every Saturday between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. There is a permit fee of \$10.00 (which can be purchased at the site or the Town Hall).

WATER BILLS

Water bills are mailed out to all Village residents each year on April 1 and October 1. Water meters are read during the months of March & September. Residents with outside meters should make sure there is clear access so it can be read. If you have an inside meter and the reader was unable to obtain the reading, please call the Village Hall to report your reading. **REMINDER:** Residents and real estate agencies should remember that a meter reading should be done prior to the sale of any Village property. You need to contact the Village Office at least three days prior to the closing, so that arrangements can be made to read the meter before the closing date.



FLUSHING HYDRANTS

The DPW will be flushing hydrants on May 10 and May 11, 2010, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. This will disturb sediment and cause water to be discolored. This should clear up in a few hours.

APPLICATIONS FOR USE OF VILLAGE PROPERTY

Individuals or groups requesting use of Village property can pick up an application at the Village Hall. The completed application must be approved by the Village Board in advance. This includes placement of temporary signs in the area of the Village Square. The Village Board meets on the second Wednesday evening of the month. Applications are approved at that time. The Village Hall 2nd floor now has an elevator for wheelchair accessibility.



STREET LIGHTS

If you notice a street light out, please report it to the Village Hall so that National Grid can be notified. We will need the pole number, street name, and house number.



SIDEWALK LINK PROJECT

The Villages of Kinderhook and Valatie are collaborating on a project to construct a five foot wide sidewalk along the west side of Route 9 linking the sidewalks in the two villages. It will also include improvements to shoulders to better accommodate bicycles. It is intended to be part of a Town of Kinderhook Trail system. Due to funding issues, the project will probably not be constructed until 2012. The project is funded with 80% federal funds, 15% state funds and 5% local funds and is being designed by Hudson Valley Engineering Associates of Beacon, NY. Project manager is Jim Dunham.

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS REQUIRED UNDER NEW LAW

Amanda’s Law, passed in the 2009 Session of the New York State Legislature, establishes a new requirement for installation of carbon monoxide detectors in homes. Under the law, one family homes, two-family homes, dwellings located in condominiums or cooperatives, and multiple dwellings must have a carbon monoxide detector installed regardless of the date of construction or sale.

The law was named after Amanda Hansen, a teenager whose life was tragically ended by a carbon monoxide leak from a defective boiler while she was sleeping at a friend’s house in January 2009. Amanda’s Law took effect on February 22, 2010.

The new law requires that the carbon monoxide detectors meet New York State standards, and that it be installed in an operable condition in dwellings where there are appliances or systems that may emit carbon monoxide, or those that have an attached garage.

One hundred per cent compliance will not only ensure compliance to the new law, but, most importantly, a safer living environment for all of

the Village of Kinderhook’s residents, especially our children.

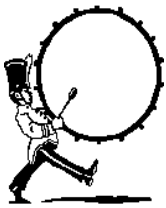

**OK 5K RACE AND YOUTH 1 MILE
RUN AND READING RAMBLE**

The Kinderhook Runners will host the 12th Annual Bank of Kinderhook OK 5K on Saturday, June 12, at 9:00 a.m. The race starts and finishes at the Village Square. The entry fee is \$15 (\$12 for students) who pre-register by June 4. After June 4, the fee for all runners is \$20.

Race includes: **5K Run (3.1 miles), 1 Mile Run and Reading Ramble.**

Residents of Hudson St., William St., Sylvester St., and Kinderknoll Dr. should avoid driving on William St. and Village square area while the youth runs are in progress (8:25 a.m. to 8:50 a.m.) We want to provide a safe environment for the boys and girls!

There will be a collection bin for the Valatie Ecumenical Food Pantry by the packet pick-up/ registration area the day of the race. Please consider bringing a non-expired, non-perishable food item.

GARBAGE REMINDERS

Both papers and containers will be picked up every Thursday. **Garbage and recyclables must be out by 7:00 a.m. to ensure pickup.** All bags of garbage must have stickers – red stickers (\$2.50) for 30 gal. bags and green stickers (\$1.50) for 15 gal. bags. Bags should be placed in covered containers and should not exceed 35 lbs. in weight. All clean recyclables – glass, tin, aluminum, plastics (#'s 1 & 2 only), milk and juice containers – should be recycled. Cardboard boxes should be flattened and tied together with string. All clean paper (newspapers, magazines, tissue boxes and junk mail) can be kept together in a paper bag or tied in small bundles and put out with other recyclables. Please make sure papers are secure so they do not blow around and do not put any recyclables in plastic bags. Oil & antifreeze containers may not be recycled. If you have questions, please contact the Village Hall or Columbia County Solid Waste at 828-2737. Garbage stickers may be obtained at the Village Office during business hours of 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and on Wednesday evenings from 5:00-7:00 p.m. Stickers are also available at Kinderhook Stewart's. **If there is a Thursday holiday, pickup will be on Saturday.**
